







YOUTH LIVING IN STABLE HOUSING



ST. JOE COMMUNITY FOUNDATION

The St. Joe Foundation Awarded two grants, totally \$55,000.

Most of us would know how to help if we saw someone having a heart attack—we'd start CPR, or at the very least, call 9-1-1. But too few of us would know how to respond if we saw someone having a panic attack or if we were concerned that a friend or coworker might be showing signs of alcoholism.

WHAT IS MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID?

Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) is an evidence-based training program administered by the National Council for Mental Wellbeing that teaches you how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental health and substance use challenges. The training gives you the skills to reach out and provide initial help and support to someone who may be developing a mental health or substance use challenge or experiencing a crisis.

Mental Health First Aid takes the fear and hesitation out of starting conversations about mental health and substance use problems. After successful completion of the training, participants will be certified in Mental Health First Aid, which is valid for 3-years.

As part of our vision of growing awareness of mental health issues and driven by our commitment to reducing the stigma surrounding mental health challenges, Life Management Center is proud to offer MHFA courses in our community.

When more people are equipped with the tools they need to start a dialogue, more people can get the help they need. Mental Health First Aiders can even save lives.

- Common signs and symptoms of mental health challenges

- How to interact with a person in crisis
- How to connect a person with help
